

DECEMBER 2013 TOPLINE RESULTS

RELEASED: DECEMBER 12, 2013

The Reason-Rupe December 2013 Poll interviewed 1,011 adults on both mobile (506) and landline (505) phones, including 277 respondents without landlines from December 4–8, 2013 from all 50 states and the District of Columbia using live telephone interviews. The margin of sampling error is +/- 3.7%. For Form A respondents (n=494), the margin of error is +/- 5.3%. For Form B respondents (n=517), the margin of error is +/- 5.1%. Princeton Survey Research Associates International (PSRAI) conducted the survey. Interviews were done in English by Braun Research, Incorporated. Statistical results are weighted to correct known demographic discrepancies. When feasible, answer choices within questions were rotated or randomized.
