

ARTICLE

In his conduct of the office of President, Richard M. Nixon, in violation of his constitutional oath faithfully to execute the office of the President and to the best of his ability, preserve, protect and defend the Constitution of the United States, and in violation of his constitutional duty to take care that the laws be faithfully executed, did receive emoluments from the United States in excess of the compensation provided by law pursuant to Article II, Section 1, Clause 7 of the Constitution, in that:

(1) He, during the period for which has has been elected President, unlawfully received compensation in the form of government expenditures at and on his privately-owned properties located in or near San Clemente, California and Key Biscayne, Florida.

(2) He, during the period for which he has been elected President, unlawfully received compensation in the form of government-financed travel by members of his family and personal friends for unauthorized and unofficial purposes.

In all of this, Richard M. Nixon has acted in a manner contrary to his trust as President and in violation of the Constitution of the United States, to the great prejudice of the cause of law and justice and the manifest injury to the people of the United States.

Wherefore Richard M. Nixon, by such conduct, warrants impeachment and trial and removal from office.
