New Retreat for Mrs. JFK

MRS. John F. Kennedy will spend this weekend in the small country home which she has just rented furnished on West Island, near Glen Cove, N.Y.

The modest, four-bedroom stone house is situated on two and half acres of wooded land and was at one time a tenant house on the former J. P. Morgan estate. The Morgan estate owns all of West Island.

The house is small enough for the widow of the late President to manage herself without servants. It is within a half hour's driving distance of New York City.

It is modest in comparison with Wexford, the

home which the late President and Mrs. Kennedy built at Atoka, Va., as their weekend retreat. Wexford is still up for sale.

However, Mrs. Kennedy can have much of the same outdoor life on Long Island that she enjoyed in the Virginia hunt country. There are stables on West Island where she can keep horses for herself and ponies for Caroline and John, Jr.

Since moving to an apartment in New York City, Mrs. Kennedy has been boarding her own

mount, Sardar, gift of the President of Pakistan, and two ponies, Macaroni and Leprechaun on Long Island. She has sold all of her other horses.

An added attraction of her new weekend home is that she becomes a near neighbor of her brother-in-law, former Attorney General Robert F. Kennedy and his wife, Ethel. The Robert Kennedys leased a house in Glen Cove shortly after the late President's brother decided to run for the U.S. Senate from New York.
