Re: Republican and 10th Amendment Task Force Votes on Rohrabacher-Farr Medical Marijuana Amendment

Below is a breakdown of last night's vote on the Rohrabacher-Farr medical marijuana amendment looking at Republican and 10th Amendment Task Force support. The key takeaway is that **both Republican support generally, and 10th Amendment Task Force support specifically, roughly doubled** between 2012's vote on the Rohrabacher amendment and last night's historic passage.

Republican Caucus

Percent Changes

In 2012, only 11.7% of Republicans who voted did so in favor of the Rohrabacher amendment. Last night, 22.17% of Republicans who voted favored the amendment – an **89.5% increase**. An even larger increase in Republican support was seen between the vote on Earl Blumenauer's amendment to promote veterans access to information about medical marijuana (VA amendment) and last night's Rohrabacher vote. Only 9.73% of voting Republicans voted in favor of the VA amendment. Last night's vote represents a **128% increase** in Republicans voting in support of reform from just a few weeks ago.

10th Amendment Task Force

Percent Changes

In 2012, 11% of members of the 10th Amendment Task Force voted in favor of the Rohrabacher amendment. In 2014, 21% voted in favor – a **91% increase**. An even larger increase was seen between the vote on the VA amendment and last night's Rohrabacher vote – only 2 members of the Task Force, or 4%, voted in favor of the VA amendment. This means that last night's vote represented a **425% increase** of 10th Amendment Task Force members voting in favor of medical marijuana than just a few weeks ago.
