SECTION III. STATEMENT OF THE PETITIONER

I, Matt Ochiuzzo, on behalf the petitioner, Orlando Police Department, state the following:

Task Force Agent (TFA) Matthew Ochiuzzo, of the Drug Enforcement Administration attended and graduated with a Bachelor of Science degree from the University of North Florida, Jacksonville, Florida, ending Fall semester of 2004.

TFA Matthew Ochiuzzo was hired by the Orlando Police Department in November of 2005 after successfully completing the Basic Law Enforcement Academy in Orlando, Florida. From November of 2005 until May of 2013, TFA Matthew Ochiuzzo was assigned to the North and West Patrol Divisions, Parramore Heritage Bike Unit, the Uniform/Undercover Drug Enforcement Division and the Metropolitan Bureau of Investigation Vice/Organized Crime Section as a duly sworn Special Investigator for the State Attorney of the Ninth Judicial Circuit. Since June of 2013, TFA Matthew Ochiuzzo has been a sworn Task Force Agent with the Drug Enforcement Administration.

TFA Matthew Ochiuzzo's has obtained advanced training in: interview and interrogation, narcotics identification, illegal gambling machines, "rave" identification, "club" drug identification, street level drug enforcement, undercover operations, tactical operations, United States Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) basic narcotics and dangerous drug investigations, advanced undercover techniques and survival, "grow" house identification and investigations, surveillance techniques, and money laundering investigations.

TFA Matthew Ochiuzzo has been a member of the Orlando Police Department SWAT Team since February 2010. TFA Matthew Ochiuzzo has also served as a TFA for the Alcehol, Tobacco, Firearm, and Explosives (ATF) and the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI). TFA Matthew Ochiuzzo has law enforcement experience involving: undercover narcotics investigations, anonymous narcotics tip investigations, prostitution investigations, gambling investigations, organized crime investigations, and tactical operations.

Your Affiant is currently the Sergeant of the Intelligence Unit at the Orlando Police Department. During the course of his investigation, your affiant learned the following:

On Saturday, February 10, 2018 UCF Police Department received a call from a known source in reference to threats made against UCF that he read on the website, Reddit, under the group thread, "UCF." Under this topic the known source stated that under the subtopic "You guys are too weak to be a school shooter" someone with the username, "TheRealUCFChris" replied "Maybe for now but not forever."

The next day, on Sunday, February 11, 2018, the UCF Police Department received multiple calls about the posts made by "The Real UCF Chris." The previous day, on February 10, 2018, under a Reddit thread regarding the autopsy of the Las Vegas mass shooter, Stephen Paddock, "TheRealUCFChris" made the comment "R.I.P. my hero."

On Thursday, February 15, 2018, a Reddit thread was created with an attached news article entitled "Shooting at South Florida high school." Under that thread, "TheRealUCFChris" commented that "Cruz is a hero!"

Through investigative techniques, on March 2, 2018, the individual with the username "TheRealUCFChris" was positively identified to be Christian Nicholas Velasquez (DOB: 09/21/1996), the respondent. It was discovered that the respondent was a current student at UCF.

On Monday, March 5, 2018, the respondent agreed to participate in a non-custodial interview at the UCF Police Department. During the course of the interview, the respondent admitted to make the posts on Reddit and stated that he idolized Stephen Paddock and Nicholas Cruz because they had the courage to go through with committing the mass shootings. The respondent disclosed that he has had thoughts and urges to commit a mass shooting since his sophomore year of high school in 2014, but did not have the courage to go through with it, yet. The respondent indicated that he believed all it would take for him to gain the courage to commit a mass shooting would be a tragic or significant life event, such as the loss of employment or a relationship breakup.

During the interview, the respondent stated that if he was going to commit a mass shooting, he would his former schools, Odyssey Middle School (9290 Lee Vista Blvd., Orlando, FL 32829) and Lake Nona High School (12500 Narcoossee Rd., Orlando, FL 32832), due to his experiences with being bullied. The respondent stated that he would use an AR-15 style semiautomatic rifle to commit those mass shootings. The respondent indicated that he wanted to

commit the mass shootings so that he could feel the "adrenaline rush" from the shooting. Both Odyssey Middle School and Lake Nona High School are within the jurisdiction of the City of Orlando.

During the course of the interview, the respondent indicated that his father kept a revolver at his residence and has handled it once. On the respondent's 19th birthday, this father took the respondent to the shooting range and taught the respondent how to shoot. Velasquez admitted to having access to \$15,000 in his bank account, but noted that not all of it was his.

When asked about whether or not he was seeing a therapist, the responded indicated that he had previously seen one (2016), but was not seeing one now. The respondent denied discussing his homicidal thoughts with the therapist. Additionally, the respondent stated that he was diagnosed with selective mutism when he was in elementary school, and that the condition lasted approximately 5 years until he was in third grade. The respondent denied taking any affirmative steps to prepare for the mass shooting, noting that it has always just been thought about in his head.

At the conclusion of the interview, the respondent was taken to the University Behavior Center (2500 Discovery Drive, Orlando, FL 32826) pursuant to a Baker Act based on his homicidal ideation. UCF Police Officer Jeffrey Panter then contacted FBI Special Agent Andrew Nadeau and OPD Detective John Cute who accompanied the Officer Panter to the respondent's home where they made contact with the respondent's father, Christian Isidro Velasquez, and his mother, Mariella Velasquez. The parents were surprised to hear the information concerning their son, but granted permission to search his room, which was unlocked. The father voluntarily turned over his firearm, a Taurus "Ultra Lite" revolver (serial number BN14573) and indicated that no other firearms were present in the home.

On March 6, 2018, the UCF Police Department applied for, and was granted search warrants for the respondent's computer and cellular telephone.

Due to the respondent's admissions of detailed homicidal ideation, your petitioner is gravely concerned that a real or perceived life event could unpredictably cause your respondent to obtain a firearm and commit a mass shooting.

WHEREFORE, the City of Orlando Police Department prays this Honorable Court GRANT the City's Petition for a Risk Protection Order.
